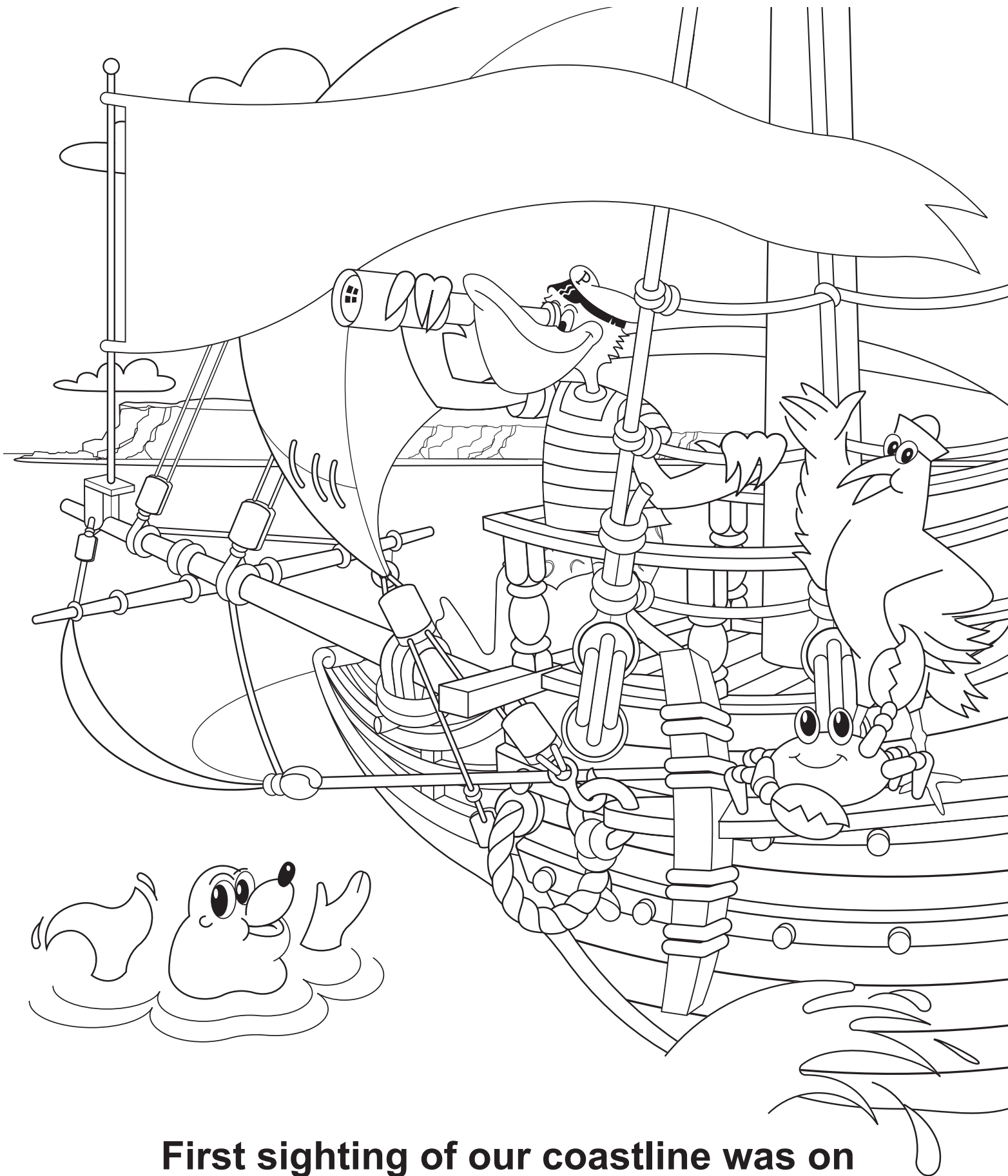

Happy 100th Birthday to the Port of Los Angeles!

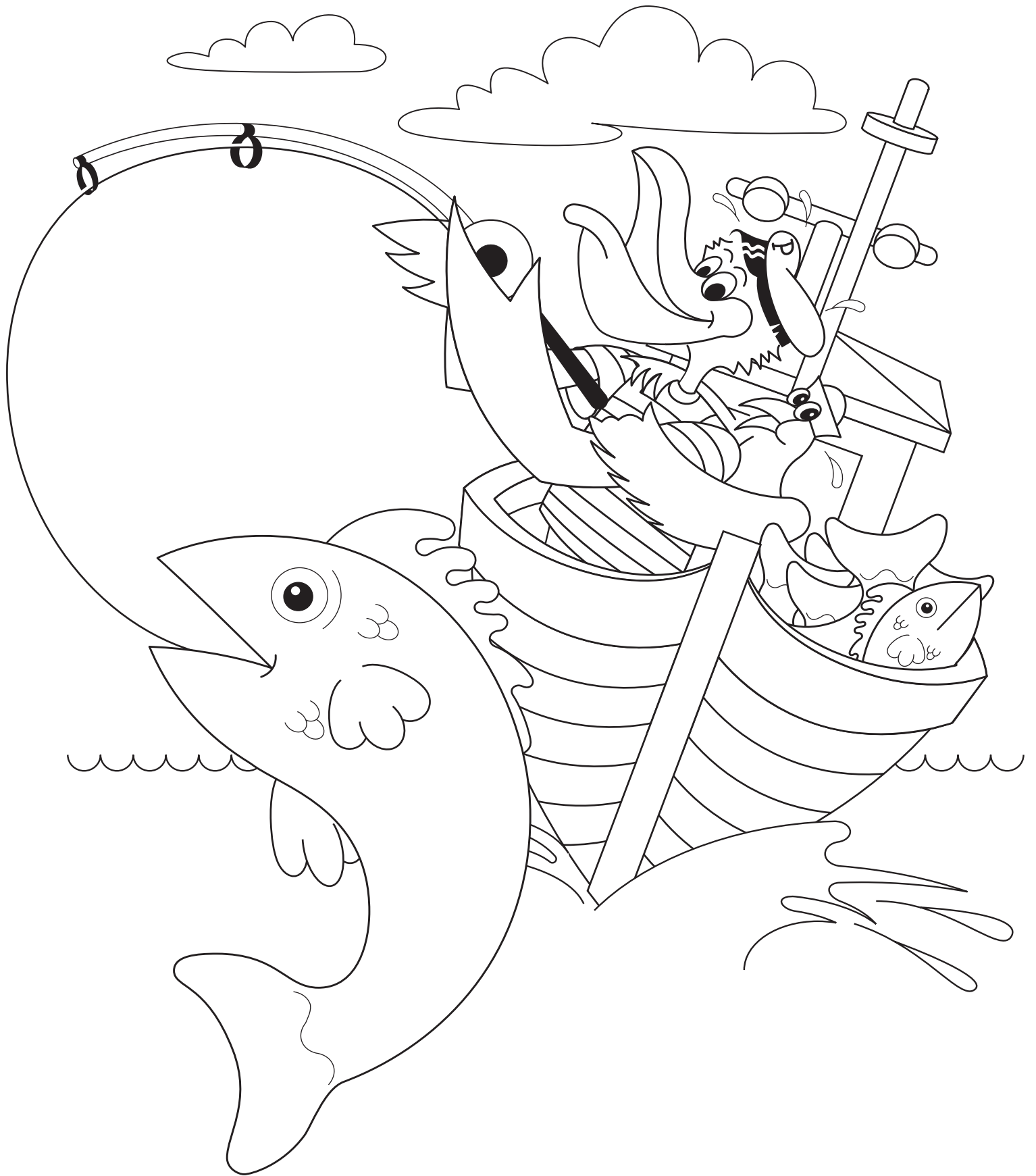

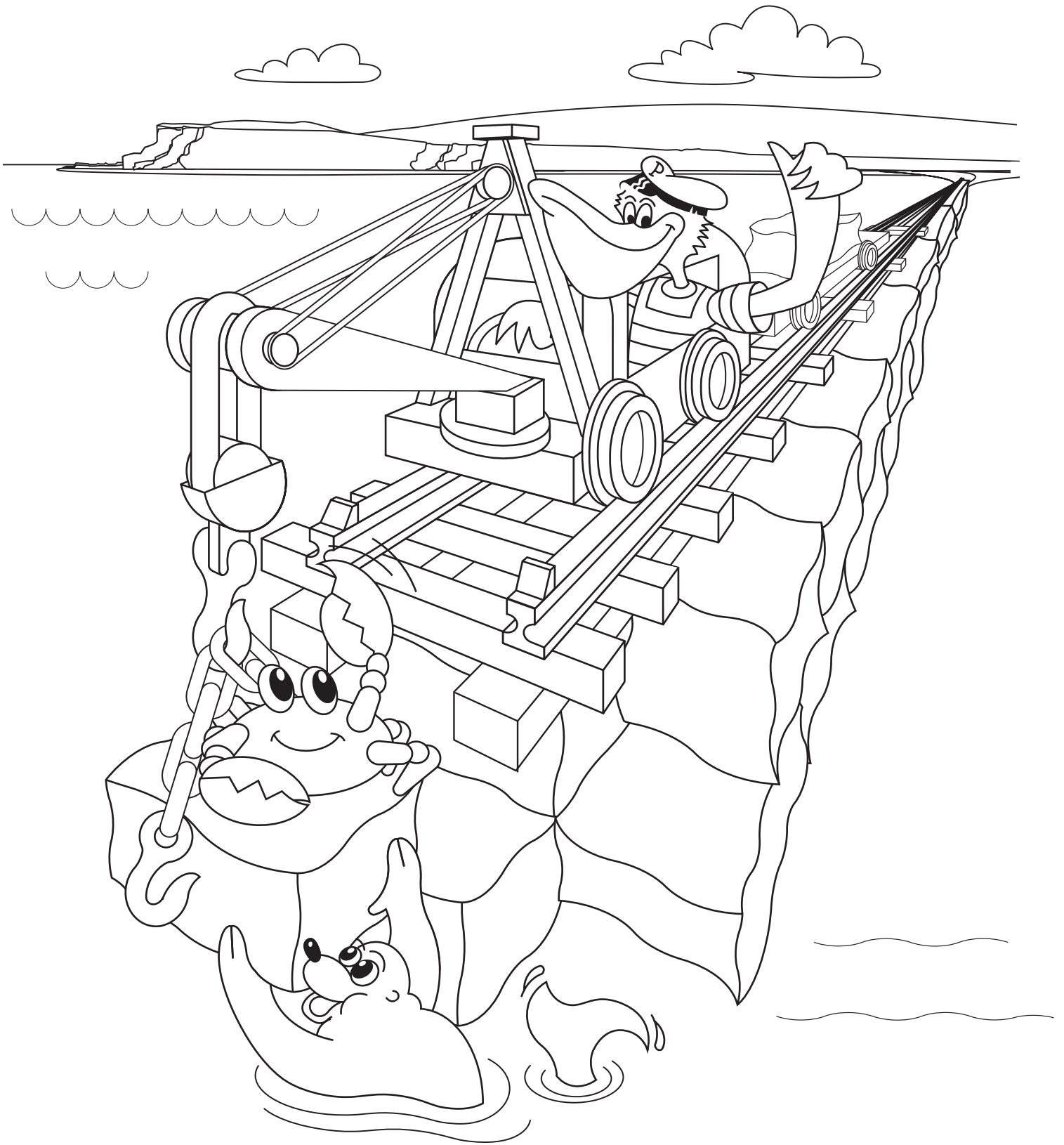
**First sighting of our coastline was on

Hides and tallow were the first types of cargo traded from the Bay of Smokes.



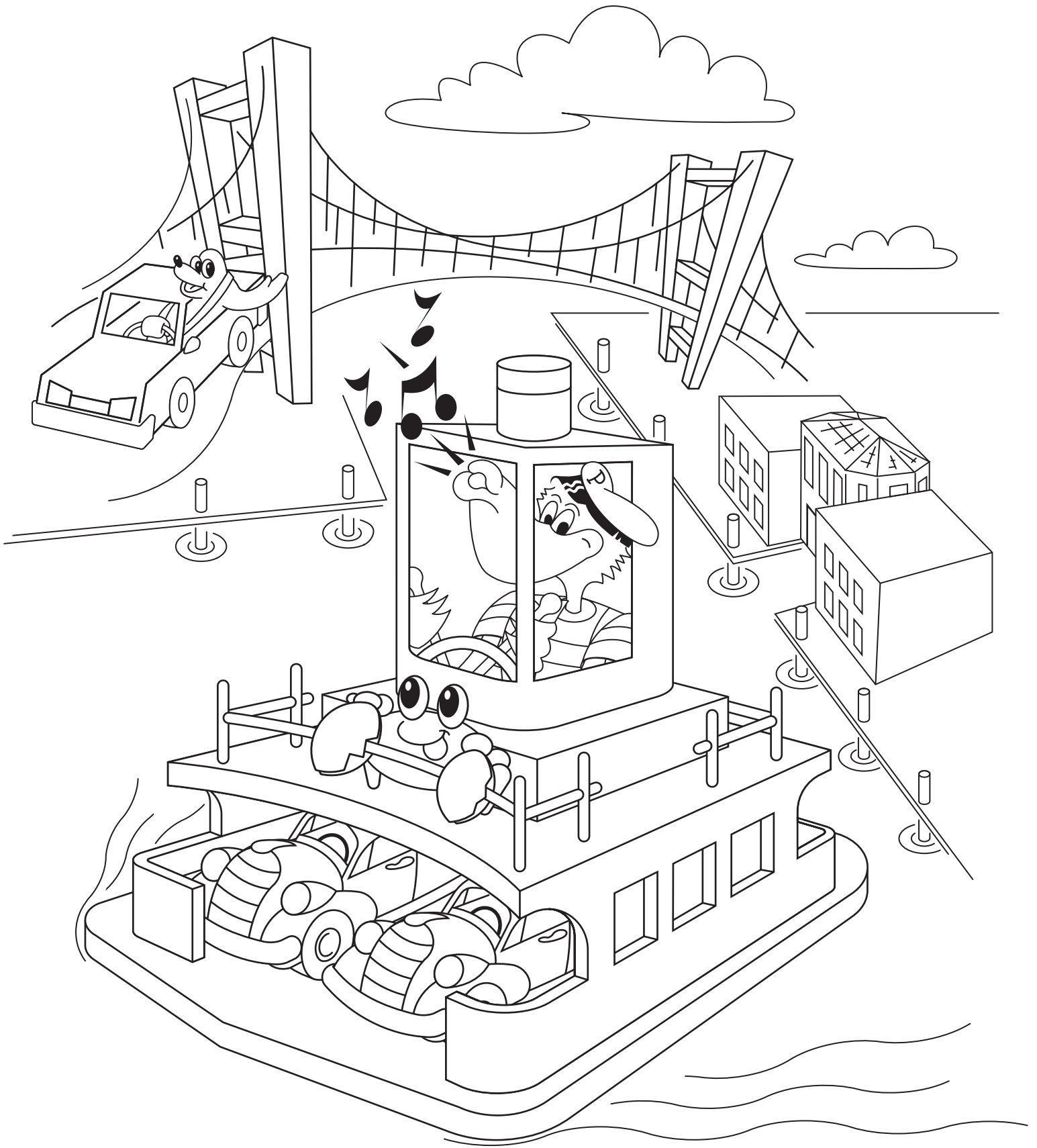
Commercial fishing was an important part of the early harbor.



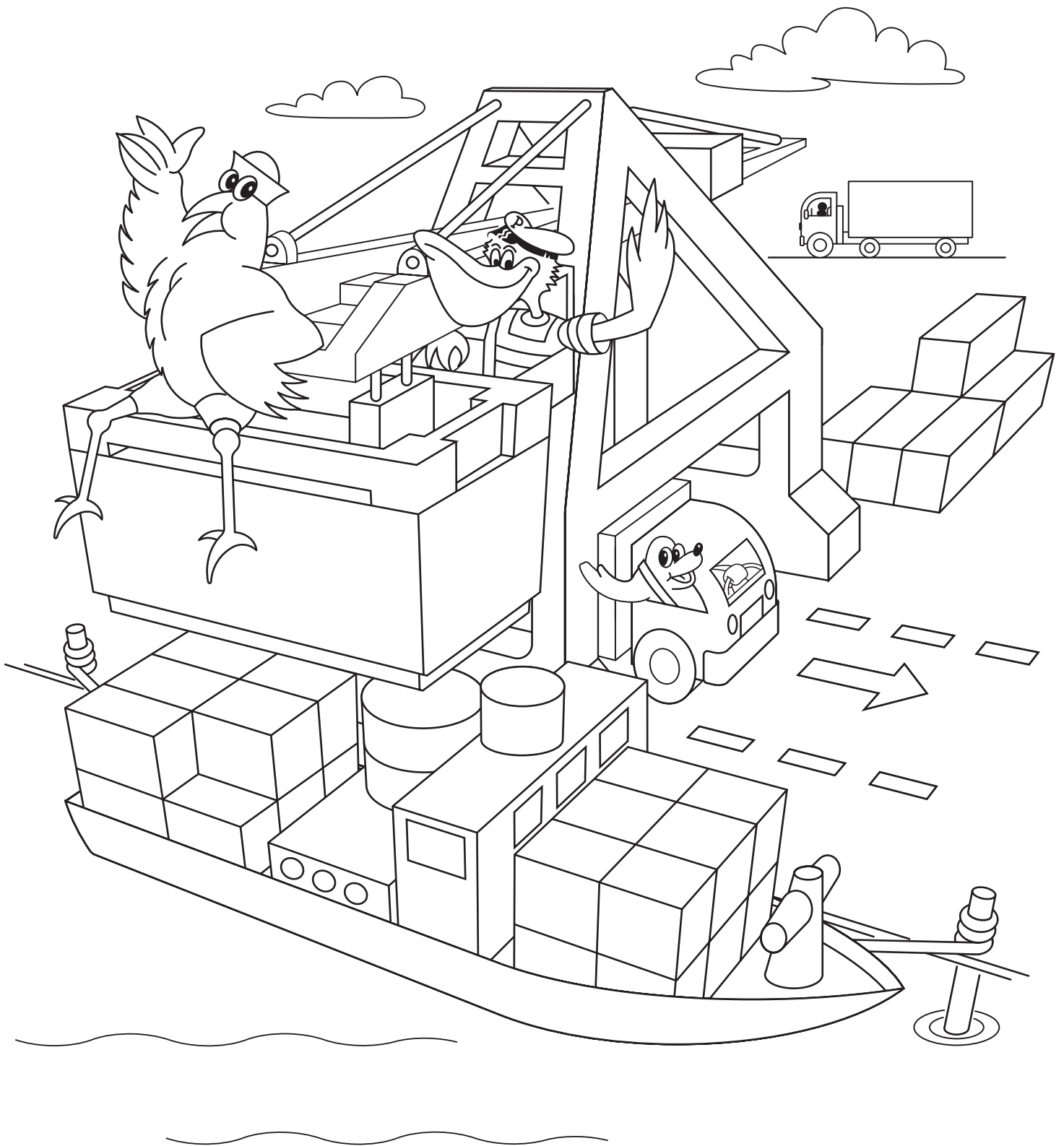
Building of the Federal Breakwater protects the Port from waves.



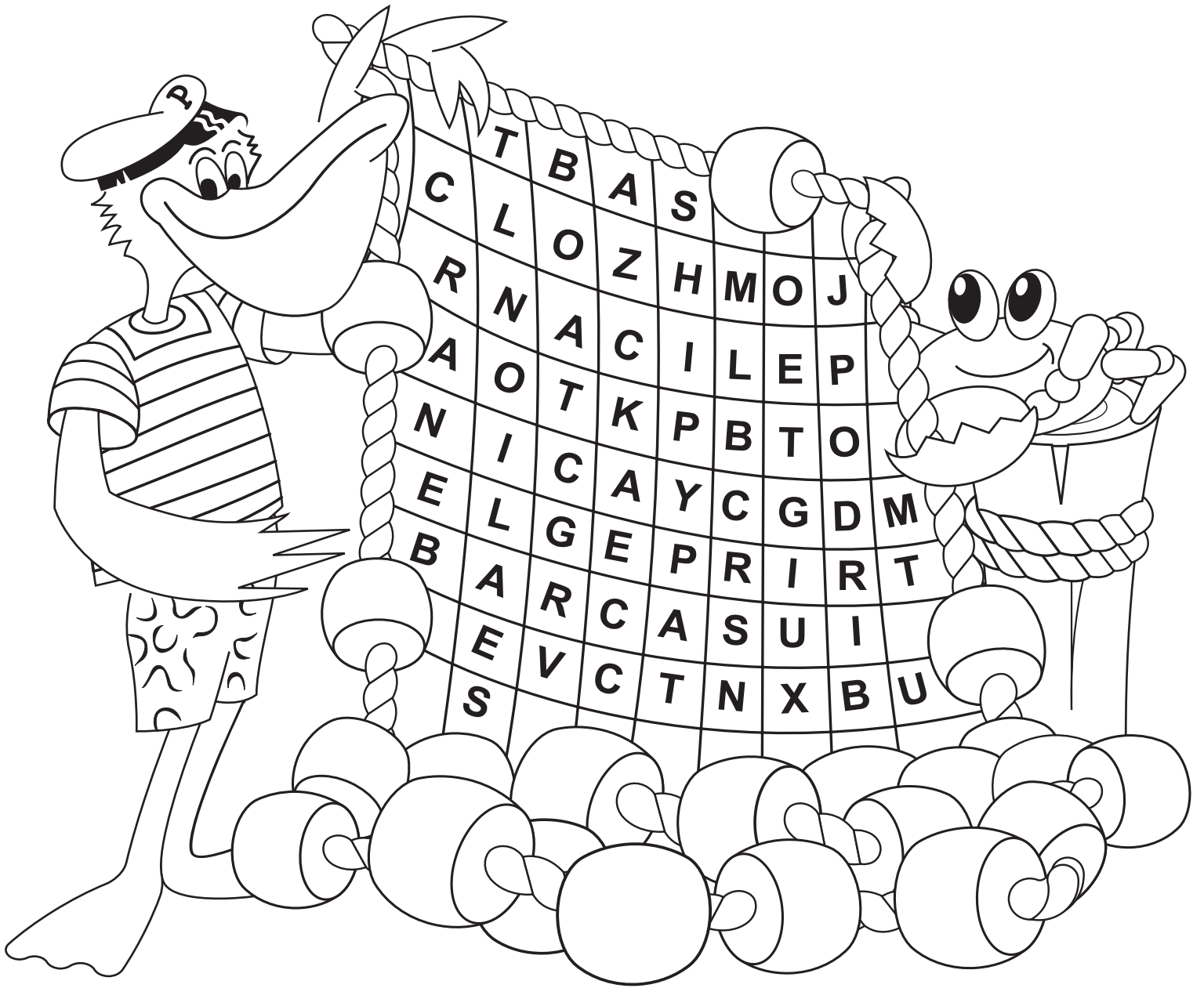
A hard-working labor force made sure all cargo came through the Port quickly and safely.

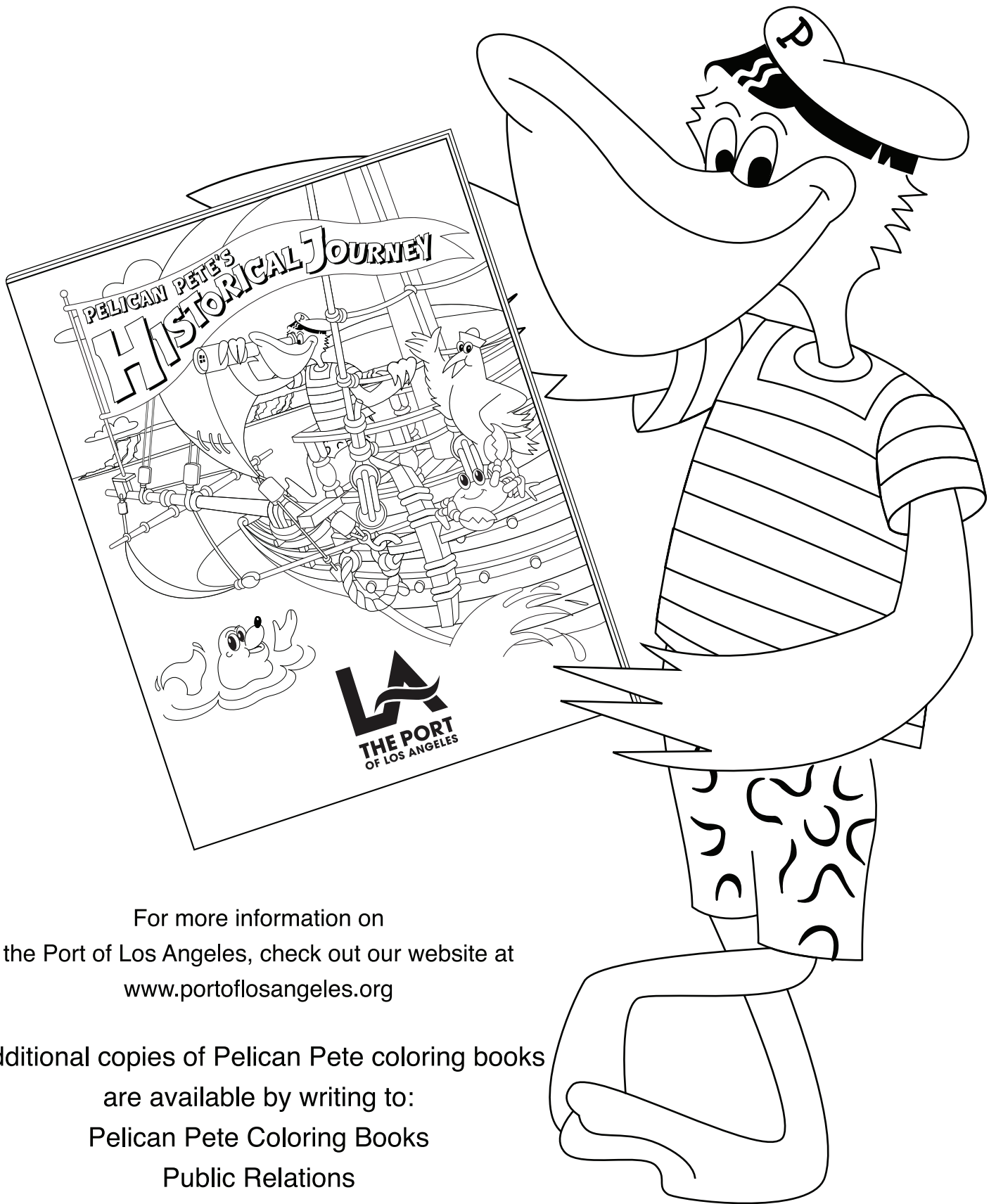
