PORT OF LOS ANGELES REGISTERS ANOTHER RECORD MONTH AS CARGO SURGES TO 877,564 TEUS



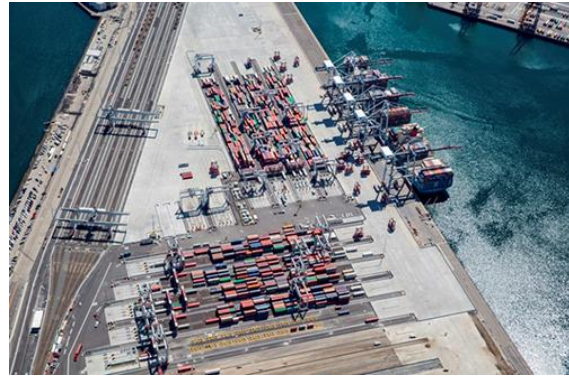
For the second consecutive month, containerized cargo flowing through the Port of Los Angeles surpassed all-time volumes for a Western Hemisphere port. Port of Los Angeles terminals processed 877,564 Twenty-Foot Equivalent Units (TEUs), eclipsing [October's](#) all-time record of 814,574 TEUs. November volumes were up 23.6 percent compared to November 2015.

ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT

PORT OF LOS ANGELES RECEIVES EPA GRANT FOR CLEAN TERMINAL EQUIPMENT



The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has awarded the Port of Los Angeles an \$800,000 grant to deploy more of the cleanest commercial available equipment for moving cargo. The award will pay between 25 to 40 percent of the cost to replace and upgrade 18 pieces of yard equipment at two Los Angeles container terminals, with the full complement due to be in service by fall 2018.
