Riordan, along with cyclists, runners and walkers will participate in the official opening ceremony dedicating the Crescent Avenue Multi-Use Pathway. The event will focus on successful community collaboration and the dedication of this first landmark project in a series of projects undertaken through a new community workshop process.

BACKGROUND: The Crescent Avenue Pathway is a 2,500-foot bike path and pedestrian walkway connecting Harbor Boulevard and 22nd Street in a residential neighborhood overlooking the Port of Los Angeles. The cost of the project has been estimated at \$125,000.
